Election Officials will begin on February 27<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 a.m. until completion opening the outer envelope, processing, and canvassing the absentee ballot paperwork (ACA §7-5-416(a)(1); Act 329 of 2023. Election officials will meet on March 5<sup>th</sup>, 8:30 a.m. for the purpose of opening the inner absentee ballot envelope and counting the absentee ballots (ACA §7-5-416(a)(1) at 8:30 a.m. on Election Day, with unofficial results being released at 7:30 p.m. until completion at the Benton Vote Center, 221 N. Main Street, Benton.

As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. The total proposed school tax levy of 40.6 mills includes 25.0 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation and 15.6 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes.
